A Message from Rev. Rich

Hello to the Church in Exile:

As St. Paul would say long ago in his greetings, "Grace to you and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Those words are still wonderful. Grace to you and peace... That is my wish to you all. Please do not be startled by the word "Exile." It is actually an appropriate word. Exile does not mean you are in prison or something, but it is also not normal life. We cannot just go where we choose, or do what we choose. In some ways we are still okay, although we are surely lonely. I know that I am. We have been facing this now for 4 months. Many of us have been meeting on Sunday mornings through ZOOM which has been at least a tolerable alternative. But it is still not what we desire, and many of our people are not able to access this.

I went back to read my words from 6 weeks ago. I said then that I had no idea when we might reopen. That is still true today. In June I mentioned that health experts were concerned that things would SPIKE as they say, due to Memorial Day celebrations. It turns out that those words were sadly accurate. I fear for my extended family members living in Florida. Covid cases are currently rising in 39 out of 50 states. The greatest fear is that hospitals would be overrun with people needing intensive care. This is happening in places right now. Even in our little Portage County the cases are rising. After 4 months of fighting this thing, this should not be the case. But it is.

Every week people mention to me that "Hey... such and such church is meeting now, they have reopened. Why not us?" There are reports of even UMC churches that have reopened where people will wear masks, stay apart, not sing, and all that, but then at the end of the service people gravitate together to visit, which I totally understand. I would want to do that too. But there is one simple truth in this: this virus continues to live as it is spread from one person to another. And the only way for that to happen is to be close together. The only way to slow it down is to stay apart and not let it spread. Diseases have been doing this very thing for thousands of years. It is simply what they do.

I need to do a full disclosure here for you all. Our East Ohio Conference has made a decision on something important. They are no longer going to tell us what PHASE we are in (we had been in Phase 2). They are letting us decide what we feel we can safely do. In our area, Nelson and Windham churches were both planning to open on July 19. But now they have changed their minds. They will not resume services in their sanctuaries. I personally believe that to be a wise move. It is difficult, but still wise. The only way to slow this down is to stay away from each other.

As we have not had a Church Council meeting for a while, I am calling for one via ZOOM for July 21 or 28. We have much to discuss. If we were to reopen, I believe we have many things to consider. I now believe that we should keep the Zoom service and the in-person sanctuary service separate. That should not be a problem. We can figure these things out. Something will be worked out.

I am working on more intentional spiritual development resources to be made available for all who might desire them. We do have Upper Room devotional guides still available. But this will be something more. I am seeking permission from a company that went out of business some years ago, so this is a little complicated. But there are some really good materials available. And it is my hope that we can make use of them.

Jill and I urge you to wear a mask when you are inside a building, not for your protection, but for that of everyone else. Please keep your distance. It just takes one party with laughing, happy people to spread the virus out to many others. Please pray for our leaders at all levels of government. Pray for our medical and health workers, as well as those agencies that are specially trained and committed to such troubles as these. And be kind to others. There are too many ugly things in the news. This is where we should be salt in the stew, and leaven in the loaf, so that we have a positive effect on others.

May God grant us wisdom for the facing of this hour.

Vintage Methodist Recipes:

Lemon Whippersnaps

I found this recipe on UMC.org and thought it would be fun to share with you. If you have any vintage recipes that you would like to share, please email/mail to attn: Gale Lane.

Many of us grew up in homes where spiral-bound church cookbooks were a familiar sight. Methodist church cookbooks have been around for more than a hundred years and the recipes and cooking methods offer a time-capsule peek into the kitchens of generations of Methodist families. This 1978 recipe for Lemon Whippersnaps cookies comes from the "Friendly Recipes" Cookbook, published by the Macedonia United Methodist Church in Raleigh, North Carolina.

1 (18.25 ounce) package lemon cake mix

2 cups frozen whipped topping, thawed

1 egg, beaten

1/2 cup confectioners' sugar

Step 1: In a large bowl combine cake mix, whipped topping and egg; mix until well combined. Chill the dough several hours or overnight (or freeze dough wrapped in plastic).

Step 2: Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Step 3: Form tablespoons of dough into one inch balls and roll them in the confectioners' sugar. Place the cookies on greased or parchment lined cookie sheet a couple inches apart.

Step 4: Bake 10 to 12 minutes until cookies are set, but not browned. Cool on wire rack.
