



A Message from Rev. Rich

Hello Friends:

While it seems clear that this COVID monster is still making its way through our nation, I have a thought for the near future... At least for a while we might have a chance to worship together, with some others, *outdoors*. The good people of Portage Faith, and Nelson/Windham have been meeting outside at Camp Asbury. They have been doing this at 9 AM. I understand that it is going well. They wear masks and sit at least 6 feet apart, but they are able to enjoy a worship experience together.

Now, here is the problem for us: we have ZOOM church on the computer at 9:30 AM. It would seem that we cannot do both, or certainly I cannot be in 2 places at once. Let me offer a temporary suggestion: Could we move our ZOOM service to 10:30 AM, so that others could worship at Camp Asbury at 9 AM? I would be doing both, and I believe I could be back before 10:30 to get online with the ZOOM regulars.

Please hear me on this one thing: it is totally clear now, as this virus rages in new areas that children can get this, and college kids certainly can get it too. While some seem to refuse to believe this, it is in fact dangerous to be INDOORS in close proximity to other people. Younger adults have been out with friends and having a happy time, but it only takes a few of them to spread the virus, and then many others will have it. It is simply how an epidemic or a pandemic works. It has always been this way.

Recently I was asked if I could say something hopeful for us, in a pastoral care way. I wish that I could. I have total confidence in the goodness and wisdom of God. I cannot say the same about humanity. I mentioned this in a sermon 5 weeks ago: I am not optimistic about our goodness, and certainly not our wisdom. I have not been optimistic about how our nation would handle this crisis. I still am not. We humans have a long history of always wanting to do things the hard way. It is a very good thing that God has never given up on wanting to rescue us, often from ourselves and our own worst actions.

I know that our numbers for COVID in Portage County are not that bad. As of today, September 1, we have had 858 confirmed cases with 65 deaths. Ohio has had over 123,000 cases and over 4,000 deaths. We need to be careful and smart about this. People do travel around. Many people do travel regularly to Cleveland, or Akron, or Kent, or Youngstown. And then they come home to Garrettsville. And it is very possible to carry the virus to our community. For this reason alone, I am still very concerned about meeting indoors for worship. I know that many of our congregation are equally concerned.

We will have quite a communication blitz here within the next week. If we are to invite folks to outdoor worship at Camp Asbury (bring your own chairs and masks) at 9 AM and then have our usual ZOOM service at 10:30 AM, we will make sure that everyone is aware of this change.

IN OTHER NEWS my Nelson Bible Study group will resume at Nelson, outdoors to start with, at 10 AM on September 14. Monday, September 14. Again, we will need to bring a lawn chair as we will be outside. But we will be together, and I look forward to that.

Even though our church has been quite dormant for the last 5+ months, we still will be asking people to serve our church in 2021. Some took positions in 2020 eager to serve, but we haven't had many meetings. We thank you anyway. At this moment there is no date for Charge Conference, but there will still be one, maybe not until November. We will prepare, and we will be ready.

Please pray for one key thing: we need testing that gives results in 24 hours instead of 5 to 10 days. That is just too late. People who have it need to stay home for a few weeks. But we have to know who carries it. Pray that this test might come soon. If we could stop spreading it around, it would fade.

God still loves us. All shall be well. Love each other. As we have been learning from our Sermon on the Mount from Jesus, in God's Kingdom to come, the meek, the gentle, the humble, the poor in spirit will be blessed. May God's Kingdom come.

EAST COAST PEACH COBBLER

Leah Schultz

1 stick butter or oleo
1 1/2 c. sugar
3/4 c. flour
2 tsp. baking powder

pinch of salt
3/4 c. milk
2 c. sliced peaches

Melt the butter in a 9" square pan and set aside. Make a batter of 1 cup sugar, the flour, baking powder, salt and milk. Pour batter over melted butter but do not stir. Batter will be thin.

Mix sliced peaches with remaining 1/2 cup of sugar and place over top of batter. Do not stir.

Bake for 45 to 50 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve hot from oven or cooled. Can be topped with cream or ice cream, delicious plain.
